The ideal candidate would be passionate about participatory community development, landscape design and planning with a number of years leading design, construction and community projects. The successful candidate would lead community planning, landscape design and construction activities for KDI's ongoing projects in Kibera and Nairobi as a key member of the offices design and construction team.

Job Responsibilities

- Provide coordination and direction on landscape design to the KDI team for the delivery of KDI projects.
- Work closely with the community KDI Community team and lead engagement with KDI's community partners for the co-development of landscape elements of Productive Public Spaces and other projects in Kibera, Nairobi and the wider region.
- Lead community partners through participatory design processes and design investigation exercises which focus on developing innovative and appropriate techniques, details



and materials for landscape construction.

- Develop landscape design concepts based on community design workshops, in conjunction with the wider design team.
- Produce landscape drawings from initial schematic design through construction documents based on community design workshops, in conjunction with the wider design team.
- Develop BOQ for landscape design costing, in conjunction with the wider design team.
- Engage with governmental partners as required.
- Construction administration and on-site supervision of site landscape works.
- Lead the development of physical maintenance guidelines for landscape elements of projects in coordination with the wider design team.
- Work on multiple design and construction projects simultaneously.
- Work in the field for significant periods as required by construction schedule.
- Direct liaison with community partners on landscape design issues, developing a positive relationship of trust with community.
- Support dissemination and advocacy program including production of maps, graphics, images, presentations, narratives and write-ups for various audiences/applications.
- Collaborate and contribute to other KDI projects in Kenya and internationally as required.
